THE ABC's OF FRAUD

Whether through the internet, by telephone, someone at your door or even by a "friend" offering you "an opportunity", you could unwittingly become the victim of fraud or a scam. At our June meeting speakers from the Rotary Club of West Ottawa and the Ottawa Police Service will show us some of the methods that scammers use and provide tips as to how to avoid becoming a target.

"The objective is to help seniors avoid being victimized by these fraudsters and scammers," said Rotary member Arthur "Bud" McGinnis, who was president of the club at the time of the program's launch in 2002.

This helpful program celebrates its 10th anniversary this year with over 500 presentations having been made to more than 16,000 audience members.

- 1. Put both lids of the toilet up and add 1/8 cup of pet shampoo to the water in the bowl.
