GUEST SPEAKER THIS MONTH:



The Hon. Bill Rompkey,
P.C., B.A., M.A., LL.D.
Former Newfoundland MP, Minister
and Senator.

His topic: "Is the Senate of Canada Relevant To-Day?"

Bill Rompkey was born in Belleoram, Fortune Bay, Newfoundland, and educated at both Bishop Field College and Memorial University in St. John's, where he received a BA diploma in education followed by an MA. He went on to study at the University of London, England, before starting a career in teaching.

Mr. Rompkey taught at Upper Island Cove and St. John's, and in 1963 was appointed principal of the Yale Amalgamated School at North West River. He then entered national politics in 1972 and was elected to the House of Commons where he served for twenty-three years.

In the 1970s, Mr. Rompkey held appointments as parliamentary secretary to the ministers of Environment, Fisheries, and Manpower and Immigration. On the retirement of Don Jamieson from federal politics in 1979, he became the senior Liberal Member of Parliament from Newfoundland and Labrador and, beginning in 1980, held cabinet portfolios of National Revenue, Small Business and Tourism, and Mines and Transport.

He chaired the House of Commons Standing Committee on National Defence and Veterans Affairs and in 1993 co-chaired the Special Joint Committee on Canada's Defence Policy. Previously, he served as vice-chair of the North Atlantic Assembly, the international body for NATO parliamentarians.

With the defeat of the Liberal administration in the 1984 general election, he became opposition critic for Consumer and Corporate

Affairs, Secretary of State and National Defence.

In 1995, Mr. Rompkey was appointed to the Senate of Canada, becoming Government Whip and deputy leader of the government in the Senate until the Conservatives took power in February, 2006.

Former Senator Rompkey retired from the Senate last May.

Follow Leacock Way to its end at Leacock Drive. **Kanata United Church** is in front of you, across the street.

PARKING at the church is limited. If full, please park in the large lot of the school next to the church or on the side of Leacock Drive where parking is permitted. Unless you have difficulty walking, please consider parking away from the front of the building in order to allow those who may be physically restricted easier access and exit.
