### THIS MONTH'S SPEAKER

William (Mac) Evans

His topic:

"Canada's Space Program"



William (Mac) Evans

A 35 year veteran of the Canadian Federal Public Service, Mac worked for more than 30 years in the Canadian Space Program. He led the development of the 1985, 1994 and 1999 Space Plans that defined and obtained approval for the Canadian Space Program and worked on the legislation for the creation of the Canadian Space Agency (CSA). Mac led the negotiation with NASA for Canada's participation in the International Space Station. In November, 1994, he was appointed President of the Canadian Space Agency, a position he held for seven years until his retirement from the Public Service of Canada in November, 2001. Following his retirement from the Public Service, Mac was a consultant to the Canadian Aerospace industry.

Mac holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering from Queen's University and a Master's of Science degree in Electrical Engineering from the University of Birmingham in England which he attended as an Athlone Fellow. He is a Fellow of the Canadian Aeronautics and Space Institute (CASI) and a Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Engineering.

In 2001 CASI awarded Mac its prestigious C.D. Howe Award for overall leadership in Canadian aeronautics and space activities. In the same year, the Association of Professional Executives of the Public Service of Canada (APEX) gave Mac special recognition for his exceptional contribution to the Public Service. In 2001 he also received NASA's Distinguished Public Service Medal in recognition of his dedicated and exceptional efforts in support of US/Canadian cooperation in space. In 2002 Mac was the recipient of the Prime Minister's Outstanding Achievement Award for his contribution to the Public Service of Canada.
