Tuesday 10 February Norm Christie: Our Sacred Places

Norm Christie will take us to the Western Front battlefields - where 'the real war is in the cemeteries' – to discover how these faraway, exquisitely designed and little visited burial grounds, with their thousands of Canadian dead, are truly our 'sacred places'.



Norm Christie is the acclaimed television host of several History Channel Documentary series

including: King & Empire, King & Country, Lost Battlefields, Striking Back, In Korea and Battlefield Mysteries. He has travelled the world following in the footsteps of Canada's soldiers, from Sicily to France, to Spain, Hong Kong, Japan and Korea

In addition Mr. Christie has written 18 books on the Canadians in the First and Second World Wars, including the 10 volume "For King & Empire" Series on which the TV Series was based. Mr. Christie was Chief Records Officer of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission in the UK, and their Admin Officer in Arras, France for five years. Mr. Christie is recognized as Canada's leading expert on Canadian



Norm Christie battlefields and cemeteries of the First and Second World War.

Most recently Mr. Christie produced a series for TV Ontario which commemorates the 100th anniversary of the Great War. In this unique series, Norm Christie takes audiences on a pilgrimage to significant Great War sites – some famous, others almost totally unknown. He discovers and tells the stories of Canadian men and women whose skills and courage turned Canada into a force on the world stage.

A metallurgical engineer by trade, Mr. Christie has combined his varied background and 20 years of research to produce a unique view into the First World War.

Wed 25 February War Museum tour this month

Don't miss this interesting day planned at the War Museum for Wednesday February 25th. Our first 45 min. tour starts at 10:00 a.m. - the **Museum Grand Tour** - "Using the stunning new building as a backdrop, this tour shows how ordinary Canadians faced extraordinary challenges. The tour includes a look at the CWM's world-class architecture, the collection of military art and dazzling exhibition galleries."

We will then have free time to explore and to have lunch at the Cafeteria, and then our second tour is at 1:00 p.m. - **The Cold War**, **Peacekeeping and Recent Conflicts: A Violent Peace –** "This tour explores Canada's military involvement during the Cold War and the Korean War, and profiles our peacekeeping activities to the present day."

We have arranged for a group rate for admission, plus two tours, for a total cost of \$17.50 (tax included). Veterans and past Canadian military personnel have free admission, so only need to pay for the tours (\$6.75). You must sign up in advance, either at the February meeting, or by contacting Judy Making – judy.makin@opera.ncf.ca before February 10th, if you wish to join us.

Notes: – The museum is fully accessible. Indoor parking is available on site for \$12.50, or take a FREE OC Transpo bus ride. From the Terry Fox Park and Ride, take #96 to the LeBreton stop; either walk 7 min. to museum or transfer to #8 (Gatineau), first stop is the museum..

- Arrival 9:45 am. Proceed from main Foyer to Group Entrance area on the left.
- First Tour 10 am to 10:45 Museum Grand Tour
- Free time and Lunch (in Cafeteria) – 10:45 to 1:00 pm
- Second Tour 1:15 to 2:00 Cold War and Peacekeeping – A "Violent Peace".


