ACCIDENTAL FRIENDS - Stories from my life in community

Beth Porter: Member of the L'Arche Daybreak community for four decades.

Beth Porter had been teaching university students when she visited a L'Arche home in 1980. At that time, Daybreak, the first L'Arche in North America, was eleven years old. In 2019, it will celebrate its 50th anniversary. L'Arche is the movement of communities started by Jean Vanier, where people with and without intellectual disabilities share life together.

Beth was born in Winnipeg and did her undergraduate work at the University of Winnipeg. She holds an MA from Queen's University and an M.Div. from the University of Toronto.

Beth taught overseas with CUSO for two years, and then in Canada. When she learned of L'Arche, she was teaching at the University of Guelph but searching for a way to live a less compartmentalized life. Her heart was quickly won over by the people she met on an initial visit to a L'Arche community. One person she met on that first visit was Michael, who asked her to "Come back!" and with whom she was stranded overnight in a snowstorm a few months later. When Beth retired two years ago, after nearly 40 years at L'Arche, she began to pull together some of the many stories of the life she shared with others there in a recent book, entitled *Accidental Friends*. Her adventure with Michael is one of those stories.

Beth Porter will be accompanied by **Daniela Bara**, the Community Leader at L'Arche Ottawa, who will tell us about the local Ottawa L'Arche.
