The Middle East – Terry Colfer

Terry Colfer started his globe-trotting ways early. Born in the UK, he was raised in Dorval, QC, and attended both McGill University and the Royal Military College in Kingston. He completed his studies with a Commission in the Canadian Army and a degree in political science.



During his military career, he served in the Gaza Strip and Europe. Upon his return to Canada, Captain Colfer (a paratrooper) accepted an offer to join the Canadian Foreign Service. His three decades plus of diplomatic service, primarily as a Trade Commissioner, included postings in Europe, Australia, the USA, Africa and the Middle East. Terry served more than 25 years of his Foreign Affairs career abroad and also held various senior management positions in Ottawa. His final diplomatic postings overseas were as Canadian Ambassador to Kuwait, Qatar, and The Islamic Republic of Iran.

Since retirement from the Department of Foreign Affairs, Terry has continued to pursue his interests in international affairs both on the lecture circuit and as an international election observer in the Middle East, Ukraine and Central Asia. Recently he completed consulting contracts with Foreign Affairs located in Ottawa, Mexico, Pakistan and Afghanistan.

In 2012 Terry was awarded the Queen's 'Diamond Jubilee Medal' in recognition of 'outstanding contributions to Canada'.

Terry is also busy as an Executive Coach, a pilot with the Rockcliffe Flying Club, Air Search and Rescue volunteer, Volunteer Adviser with CESO, and Board of Directors member with the Conference of Defence Associations Institute, Gatineau Gliding Club, and the Royal Military College Foundation. Not one to sit still, Terry loves skiing, scuba diving, running, riding his motorcycle, golfing, and watching the sun set with a good book, though preferably with a glass of wine.
