Coming Up

Friday, September 20 – Canopy Growth Tour

This season's first outing takes place on Friday, September 20 when we will be touring the Canopy Growth Facility at 1 Hershey Drive in Smiths Falls. The tour will begin at approximately 10:15 at the Visitor's Centre.

Parking is quite limited at this site, therefore, we propose that those driving to SF meet at the "By the Falls" parking lot near the corner of Beckwith Street S. and Main Street W. by 9:45. The entrance to the lot is off Main Street West and the cost at the lot is 50 cents per hour. From there we can carpool or shuttle people the short distance to Canopy Growth. For those who have handicap signs for their vehicles, there are 4 designated spots at Canopy Growth.

Lunch will be at the Fort Hemlock Restaurant, 32 Beckwith Street S. at 12:45. This eating spot overlooks part of the Rideau River but also is adjacent to the parking lot we are using, so no need to move the cars.

For those interested, the Rideau Canal Visitor's Centre is within a few steps of the restaurant. They are open until 4 pm and admission is free. You can explore the 4 floors of information and artifacts related to the historic Rideau Canal. There is an elevator in the building.

Even if you signed up on the "interest sheet" last May, we need to confirm the number of participants and determine who plan to car pool or use their vehicles to shuttle others.
