At our March Meeting - Sue & David Williams

Sue Williams has been a practising OT for over thirty years. In 2007-08, Sue with her husband David, both not yet retired and without having any blue water experience, set out to circumnavigate the Atlantic in a 39 foot sailboat. This was her husband's dream, but Sue did not like sailing and had no adventure-seeking desires. What finally convinced her to take the plunge was the thought that leaving their 3 teenage sons to their own devices would allow them to mature and discover their own way in life without parental interference.

David and Sue's journey lasted 373 days, covered 11,000 nautical miles and encompassed 14 offshore passages totalling 86 days at sea. They survived 9 storms and 14 breakdowns – the most serious being an encounter with a loose fishing net which fouled their propeller, tore their engine from its moorings and created a leak around the propeller shaft where it entered the boat.

Safely home, Sue studied the craft of writing and finally left the health care field in 2016 to focus on a book about their experience. Her memoir, *Ready to Come About*, was published by Dundurn Press in May 2019.
