Tuesday 13 June A Multimedia Artist's Perspective on Climate Change

Multimedia artist Sandra Hawkins' visual narratives inspire beyond the scientific data on impacts of climate warming in the High Arctic and on our rivers closer to home, including the St. Lawrence Seaway. Her presentation shows how her recent "In Search of Bearings" installation shown at the City of Ottawa Corridor 45/75 Gallery, 2022-2023, brings together disparate inspirations and experiences from her High Arctic Artist Tall Ship Expedition, Ottawa River leisure sailing and St. Lawrence River navigation. Sandra states "My intent is to create spaces that resonate and generate discussion on the physical and ephemeral impacts of climate warming".

Sandra Hawkins is an acclaimed multimedia artist based in Ottawa with

local and international exhibitions, publications and collections. Her paintings, photography, videos and installations resonate with the dynamic impacts of climate change on place identity. In 2023 her Ottawa exhibitions include In Search of Bearings at Corridor 45/75 Gallery, Metamorphosis at City Hall Art Gallery, Through the Reeds, and Across the Water at Ottawa Art Gallery Annexe, and Paint the Town Pink Ottawa Art Gallery Gala fundraiser. Sandra is an author and self-publisher of two books, Sailing The Top of The World – Climate Change in the High Arctic, and The Business of Art – Visual Artists in Canada.


