Johanna Lemke: author of Enemy Under Our Roof

A childhood memoir from the Nazi occupied Netherlands, 1940 – 1945

Johanna Lemke lived through the horrors of WWII and is the author of a riveting, inspiring, and informative memoir. Enemy under Our Roof is based on the author's experiences in war-torn Hengelo, the Netherlands. She endured nights of terror spent in the cellar during air raids and during the dreaded razzias, when friends and neighbours were taken away to the camps, but she also found joy in billeting three Canadian soldiers for four months after the liberation, one of whom encouraged her family to immigrate to Canada.

Johanna is a graduate of Ottawa Teacher's College. After eleven years of teaching elementary school both in Lyn and Ottawa, she took writing courses at Algonquin College and the University of Ottawa. At Carleton University, she studied Children's Literature as part of her combined English/German major. She's a member of the online WriteforKids/CBI organization and a regular contributor of articles and children's stories to her church's quarterly magazine. When she's not writing, Johanna enjoys reading, research, nature, architecture, science, classical music, theatre, art, and travel.
